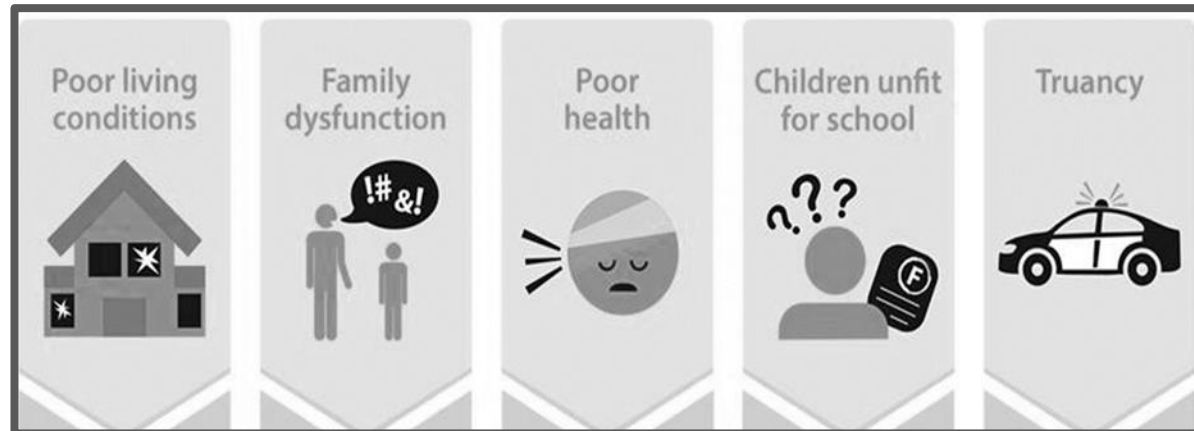
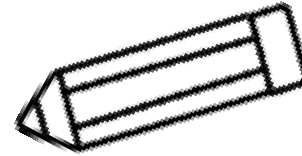

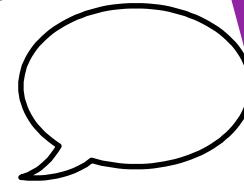

- No transparency of funding arrangements and associated responsibilities

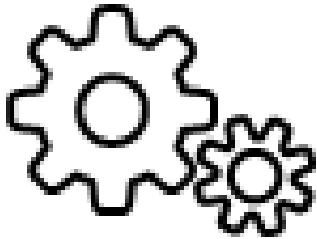
DUPLICATION

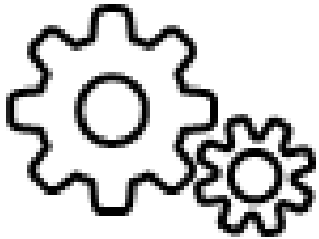

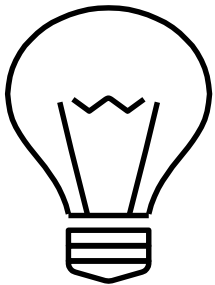
1. Collaborative planning/needs assessment
